MTLS CEMETERY

Mrs. Lucille Grooms of Peoria, Ariz. sends the following additions and corrections to the listing of the cemetery that was in our last Newsletter.

Row 4: Mary Ann Worsham was the 1st wife of William Wade Moseley. The Susan was 1st dau. of W.W. (not A.W.) and Mary Ann Moseley. She was born 1846 and died 1859. Julia F. was dau. of W.W. Moseley (not A.W.) and Martha Pierce, his 2nd wife. Also the Mary Frances b. 26 Aug. 1863 d. 26 Aug. 1858 could have been their daughter. The others were all on the census records.

Anderson Wade Moseley was born 10 May 1801 and Rebecca McLemore was born 8 Mar. 1805. They were married 04 Nov. 1822.

MTLS (cont)

Thanks to Lucille Grooms for catching the W W Moseley in the cemetery listing. I (ETT) think we may have found William Wade Moseley. The marker is a Confederate one and I have been told that these markers were placed by the UDC at some point in time. The Beach marker is the same. Who is he ? The WWM marker has apparently been moved - why, when, or by whom I do not know. It is in the Supples part of the cemetery, facing the wrong way, and between two Supples' graves. Research at Archives reveals that a WWM applied for a pension in 1901 and was 78 at the time. Fits. Perhaps some of William Wade's descendants would like to pursue this and consider moving the marker by Mary Worsham.

The Cleghorn "sisters" sent additions and corrections to Row 8 in the MTLS listing. Where it says "Daught of" should be Infant son of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. C. Cleghorn born and died 1927. To William C. Cleghorn, Ala Sgt 326 Inf ,82 Div. Add World War], b. May 9, 1896 d. May 9, 1942. Unmarked??? Infant son of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. C. Cleghorn b. Aug. 23, 1940 d. Aug. 24, 1940 Name Garrett Franklin Cleghorn. Urquhart, Charles Hilton b. Jan. 20, 1890 d. Feb. 27, 1940. Urquhart, Edna (3 yrs.) Oct. 13, 1937 d. Jan 19, 1940. Boy Infant Sept. 8, 1934. Girl Infant Aug. 16, 1940. Thanks for information.

Incidentally, Lula Davidson says the correct spelling of William Waid Moseley's middle is Waid.

HOPE HULL POST OFFICE

1852 ALABAMA TAX ASSESSMENTS
MONTGOMERY COUNTY
BUTLER'S MILLS BEAT
Real Estate

The tax assessment records for 1852 Montgomery County, Alabama are on microfilm (M448, Reel 1) at the Alabama Department of Archives and History. Copies made from the microfilm are in the Pintlala Historical Association files at the Pintlala Library. These records show the owner of the real estate, the description of the property, total number of acres, value and the amount of Alabama real estate tax owed. The tax was \$.20 per \$100 property value. There is a companion tax record showing personal property tax assessments which included such items as number of slaves, horses, buggies, clocks, jewelry etc.

Butler's Mills Beat included owners of property in Range 17, Township 13, and the Western sections of R. 18, T. 13. Thomas Butler was one of the large landholders having acquired several hundred acres of land in the Eastern portion of the township. The present day Butler Mill Road traverses much of this property.

The following data was transcribed from the microfilm copies by Mamie M. Sellers, August 1990. The names are in the same order as they appear in the record and spellings are as recorded. Only the section numbers of the land have been included but the record contains the legal description as well so those who are interested in a more exact location of the property may refer to the microfilm or to the copies at the library.

* - An asterisk preceding a name refers to notes following the data.

Note: The last three columns refer to total acreage, total value and tax owed.

* The property shown as being owned by "Joseph A. Sellers" in this record is the same as that shown in 1859 as being owned by "Jas. A. Sellers". In as much as James A. Sellers is shown in other records as a resident of the area and Joseph A. Sellers does not appear in other records for the area we believe the name "Joseph A. Sellers" to be a clerical error and should be "James A. Sellers".

The Alabama Tax Assessment Montgomery County for 1859 is found on microfilm (M448. Reel 2) at the Alabama Department of Archives and History. The tax rate is the same as the rate in 1852 - \$.20 per \$100 of evaluation. It is interesting to note that in general the appraisals tend to be higher in 1859 than they were in 1852. This data was transcribed from copies of the microfilm by Mamie M. Sellers, August 1990:
