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A BOOK OF FACTS

Catherine Sellers has loaned us an interesting booklet entitled "Spirit of America" by Dan Valentine. It is chock full of little known facts about our country. We plan to enlighten you with humorous and serious facts connected with the War Between the States, as contained in this book.

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GOLD IF YOU CAN FIND IT

From "Spirit of America"

There is still some gold around from the Civil War--all you have to do is find it! Old record books reveal that in the chaos of defeat, at least two Confederate units buried gold...and never returned for it. The first instance occurred during the last days of the conflict. Retreating Confederate soldiers hid \$500,000 in gold in the swamps of the Everglades. And then in 1864, Confederate soldiers buried some \$250,000 near St. Albans, Vermont. Neither cache has ever been found.

REHOBOTH CHURCH REGISTER

The Church Register has been xeroxed. Hand written on the title page is: "Rehoboth Church was commenced building in 1853 and finished in 1854. Received the 8th of March 1854 & dedicated the 12th of March 1854 by J.C. McDaniel Pastor in charge". The date the church was organized is not known but the earliest member on the list below is V. or R.H.S. Cross received in 1832. The church was originally located south of Mt. Carmel in what is now Crenshaw County at the site where Magnolia Baptist Church was later located. The building mentioned above was on Hickory Grove Road near the W.A. Guy residence. Rehoboth Methodist Episcopal Church merged with Mt. Carmel Methodist Protestant Church in 1939. The building was dismantled in 1940 and some of the lumber was used in the construction of the Government Street Methodist Church in Greenville. The Register is at Mt. Carmel Church.

Register of Church Members:

The register is arranged alphabetically and there are three rolls represented. The earliest is undated but an analysis of the handwriting would seem to indicate that it was transcribed from previous lists in early 1880s. The second is the Roll of 1916 and the third is the Roll of 1924. This list represents a combination of the three lists.
