I hope each of you saw the great write-up of our Association by Mr. Joe Azbell in the March 17th Montgomery Independent. There will be copies available if you missed. Our thanks to Laurie Sanders for instigating the idea.

A historic marker has been placed by Will Hill and Felix Tankersley on a hillside on the J.M.Todd property. It reads:

*Near this spot lies John Roy Tankersley who was born May 8, 1768 at Port Royal, Virginia and died June 8 1839 at Pintlala, Alabama. A resident of Franklin, Tennessee, he enlisted in General John Coffee's Brigade of Calvary in General Andrew Jackson's Army of Tennessee Volunteers at Nashville December 10, 1812. He fought the Creek Indians in Alabama and the British at Chalmette.

Returning from the Battle of New Orleans in 1815 he camped with a group of his comrades a few miles north of here at Allen's Hill on the banks of Pintlala Creek. He married Sarah Brooks, his second wife, September 18, 1816. In 1821 he moved his family to Alabama settling in this area of Montgomery County where he farmed, reared his children and died*

A history of the Guy family donated by Norman G. Guy is in the library files. Thank you.

The book, <u>Alabama - A Guide to the Deep South</u>, is a fairly comprehensive history of Alabama. The new revised edition, 1975 by Alyce Billings Walker, is available. The original guide was written in 1941 by Jack Kytle and Luther Clark through a grant from the Writer's Program of the Works Progress Administration. Luther Clark was the father of Julianne Hataway.

Again thanks to Laurie Sanders: We have received a book by Mr. M.N.Lawrence of Birmingham entitled "Genealogy Boyd - Kirkpatrick - Butler Family of Montgomery County, Alabama (and adjacent counties) in the 19th century and sketches of some related families Montgomery County and Elsewhere - Brooks - Barnes - Ekwurzel - Mitchell - Runyan - Thurmond - Turner - Warfield, et al." Most interesting and will be on display.

The Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts has donated a plaster bust of Bibb Graves to the PHA. It was done by Margaret Whetstone. Bibb Graves was governor of Alabama from 1927 - 1931 and 1935 - 1939. He and his wife, Dixie Bibb, (first cousin) were from Hope Hull. E.T.T.

JANUARY MEETING: notes from minutes

There were 43 persons attending our January meeting. Those not present missed a most interesting program by Frank Hawthorne which traced the history of early churches of major denominations in Montgomery County; Bethel Primitive Baptist in Pintlala being one of the earliest. Julianne Hataway had prepared an exhibit about the Bethlehem area. The treasurer's report showed a balance of \$718.95. An application for tax-exempt status for the organization will be filed. A motion to purchase a new 4 drawer file and file folders to hold an increasing amount of information was approved. Mrs. Mary Lillian Rosier gave a well-researched report on the possibility of sponsoring a crafts show. The decision was made to sponsor a booth at shows at Hooper and South Montgomery Academies before trying to organize a separate affair. Vera Kraus will chair a committee to investigate changing the name of Pettus Road to the more generally used "Pleta Road". Mrs. Todd reported that a request had been made to the county to place "Ball Branch" signs where Pettus Road crosses that stream. (These are now in place). N.M.S

DID YOU KNOW?: If you had owned a clock or a watch in Montgomery County in 1862 you would have had to pay \$.25 personal property tax. Other items that the tax collector wanted to know about were jewelry, horses, cows, conveyances (buggles, carriages) other than farm wagons and ox carts, and number of slaves (taxed according to age and sex). Montgomery County personal and real property tax returns for that time period are on microfilm in the Archives and provide interesting information about families living in the county.

Where in the world are you? The surveyors land descriptions can locate a piece of property precisely - not only in the county but in the world when the reference is continued to include latitude and longitude. Coming next quarter: information about land descriptions, townships, ranges, sections etc.

LIBRARY HOURS: The Pintlala Public Library is open on Wed, Thu, and Fri 1:30 - 4:00 PM and Sat 9:00 - 11:00 AM.

Bethel Primitive Baptist Church at Pintlala was organized in 1819. The first building was of hewn logs later replaced by a large frame building. It had at one time a very large membership and congregation. The people would come from a great distance in wagons, carriages, buggles and ox-carts. The church would frequently not hold the congregation and they would preach under the shade of the trees. (From Recollections of the Early Settlers of Montgomery County, Alabama by W.G. Robertson 1892.)

These names were taken from a list of members compiled from Bethel records by Mr. Franklin S. Mosley, Butaw, AL. on file in Alabama Archives. We did not include names from that list which were obviously duplicates. Apparently some members withdrew by letter or were expelled, dismissed or excluded for various reasons and were later restored to membership. Bethel Church minutes show that in November 1833 the following persons applied for letters of dismission to form a new constitution which was granted: Wm. T. Pouncey, Edward M. Bussey, William Finley, John Simmons, Walter Boyd, Peter Pouncey, Wm D. Blackmon, Mary Pouncey, Huldy D. Bussey, Mariah C. Stinson, Emily Finley, Sarah Pouncey, Anna Pouncey, Blizabeth Cleghorn. The new "constitution" formed by this group was Bethlehem Church several miles to the south of Bethel Church. It is interesting to note that the largest increase in membership took place in the 1830s and coincides with the dates on the county tract books when large acreages of land in townships 13 and 14 were first purchased. In addition to the names listed below there were 45 black males and 76 black females shown as members during this time.
