HEALTH DEPARTMENT HERE WINS U.S. HONOR

The Montgomery County Health Dept. has been awarded a certificate of appreciation by the U. S. Public Health Service for its role in the past three years in collecting information on the problem of air pollution, Dr. Douglas L. Cannon, health officer, reported Saturday.

According to Dr. Cannon, the award is signed by Dr. Luther L. Terry, surgeon general of the U. S. Public Health Service, and Vernon G. MacKenzie, chief of the Division.

In his announcement, Dr. Cannon reports that the Montgomery County Health Dept. is one of 250 stations in the United States participating in the National Air Sampling Network of the Public Health Service. Samples of pollutants collected in this program under the direction of C. E. Rittenberry, chief of the County Health Dept.'s division of sanitation, are sent for analysis to Robert A. Taft Sanitary Engineering Center maintained by the U. S. Public Health Service in Cincinnati. The data obtained help to explain the nature and extent of air pollution problems throughout the country, Dr. Cannon states.

Accepting the award for the county health department, Dr. Cannon said: "The air we breathe must be carefully examined if we re to live and work in an environment pleasant and healthful. We are proud to be a part of the national effort to meet the challenge of air pollution."

MON-CRE CHANGES NUMBERING SYSTEM; SUBSCRIBERS LISTED AMOUNTS TO 760

The Mon-Cre Telephone Cooperative, which announced at the weekend a new system of numbering in connection with an expansion program started in May, lists 760 subscribers.

The new system will use seven digits instead of the former exchange designations of JU and JE.

Mon-Cre Telephone Cooperative began operations Oct. 29, 1954, with only 174 subscribers. The number has more than quadrupled in its eight years of operation.

Included in the expansion program were a new warehouse at the headquarters in Ramer: new switchboard equipment in the laPine and Ramer exchanges double the size of the former equipment, and enlargement of the Pine Level exchange switchboard; construction of new lines to serve 176 subscribers and reinforcement of existing lines heavily overloaded. The new lines serve subscribers from Macedonia to China Grove, from LaPine to Bradleyton and Helicon, from Ramer to Ada and others on the Houlton road.

Information on the new numbers will be given by the Southern Bell long distance operator in Montgomery, who has a complete listing. Mon-Cre Cooperative has a contract with Bell to furnish information service.
